NORTH PEACE

The North Peace School District has most of its schools in an area bounded by the Peace River in the south, the Alberta border on the east, the Rockies in the west, and a rather nebulous border 100 miles to the north.

In a very real sense, this region has a prairie terrain. One could refer to the area as wooded plateau country with gentle rolling hills. Rivers and creeks are deeply eroded and provide for scenic breaks as they meander through valleys up to 400 meters below the regular terrain.

The local vegetation is varied but generally could be referred to as forest, both deciduous (poplar) and evergreen (pine and spruce). Forestry is a major industry.

Most of the rural schools cater to the children from our farming and ranching areas. The farms are large and emphasize the production of grain, canola, grass seeds and cattle. Fort St. John is a typical prairie town in that it has a series of grain elevators.

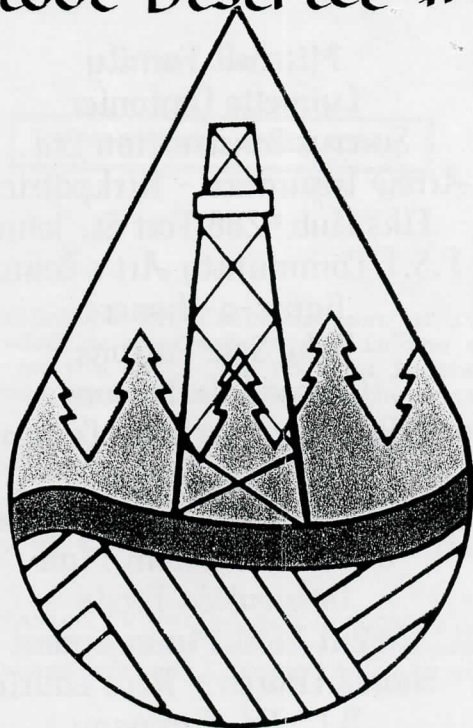
The key impetus to the economy comes from the oil and gas industry. It is this industry which has been the real cause for our "up and down" economy. In a normal year the drilling activity in the oil patch employs hundreds of workers. The oil and gas service industries, however, provide the backbone of our economy. Production of oil and gas is evident throughout the whole area.

In a very real sense, the Peace River Block is the energy capital of B.C., but also over one half of the electricity for the province of British Columbia comes from here. Two dams are now complete and the third is a distinct possibility. The coal deposits of the Peace are also in the development stage and give a further boost to the economy.

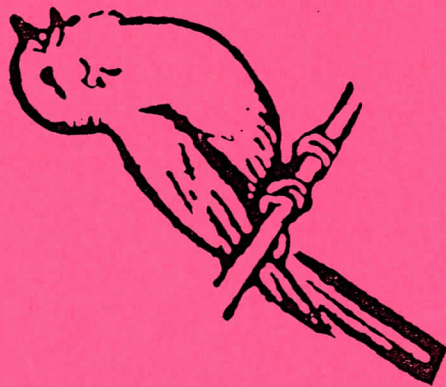
