Treasurers Report

Barb Loehndorf reported that there is \$9,648.20 in the account and the old account has been officially closed. We have loaned the Heritage Festival \$1,200 which will be reimbursed when their funds arrive. We have received the Cultural Services Grant of \$4,645 (basic assistance), \$1,000 (local gov't match), and \$1,500 (activity bonus) for a total of \$7,145 which will be distributed to the groups at the AGM. c) new by-law and totally locked into RD

Audrey Gaddy has agreed to do paintings of the pioneers, an article was in last weeks Regional Weekly, the first brochure will be coming soon and a meeting has been set for Wednesday, April 24, at 7:30pm at the Artspace for all participating groups to discuss ideas.

Costing ABCAC in Castlegar - Barb reported that the fares to Castlegar are \$288 plus tax retrurn via CPAir. Via PWA cost is \$233 plus tax return but would involve going through Dawson Creek. Names must be in by April meeting. So far Sue, Norma and Donna are interested in going.

Arts council will pay \$400 for two persons to go.

Jack Anderson - Sue reported she has met with Jack and he is now employed at the BC Pavillion at Expo '86, and he will be in charge of on site entertainment. He is looking for up beat type of music shows on a northern theme.
