Artist Profile: Tom Kirschner

In his twenty years with the Fort St. John theatre group Stage North, Tom Kirschner has played many parts, both on and off stage. His passion for the theatre has helped to build the reputation Fort St. John has for dramatic talent and award winning productions.

Tom moved to Fort St. John as a child and discovered a love for the theatre in grade school. As an adult he

joined Stage North for the first time in 1983 with a production of Fiddler on the Roof. Since then he has taken part in at least 23 productions, as an actor, director.

producer, and even a set builder. 2003 saw Tom's third win at the Peace River Zone Theatre Festival, taking home Best Actor accolades for his role in *Because He Can*. He went on with the troupe to the provincials and won for Best Actor there as well. Tom is a true team player and expresses his excitement about the reputation Fort St. John & Stage North is gaining for quality in drama. He has seen the respect for northern talent grow even in the past couple of years.

Some of Tom's most memorable productions over the years include *Noises Off*, in 1999, which he not only acted in, but directed and produced. He also

built the set, an enormous and complicated piece. Another favourite was *Little Shop of Horrors*, in which he played the dentist. Tom explains that he greatly enjoys playing villains, getting to explore an evil character

After over 20 years, Tom will be stepping back his involvement in Stage North, though this doesn't mean the Peace Region has seen the last of Tom Kirschner. Tom will continue his involvement with the theatre group he started in 2000, Bridge to Broadway, which has evolved over the years into a comedy troupe partnered with Dennis Szalai. Tom is hoping for continued growth with that group, and he will also be expanding his skills as he tries stand up comedy. Tom recently took a workshop with YukYuk's founder Mark Breslin, and hopes to bring a smile to the faces of our region as he learns this new craft.

On March 12th & 13th Michael Armstrong (from Ouesnel) was in Hudson's Hope to facilitate 2 workshops. Michael is a playwright, actor, teacher and poet and so we were able to use his wide range of talents to present a Youth Drama Workshop for the school children as well as a Poetry/Prose Workshop for adults.

On the Friday, he had an energetic day playing theatre games and offering directing tips for the actors in the up and coming school drama production "The Lion, the Witch & the Wardrobe".

On the Saturday he spent the day working with 8 local poets and writers, many of whom gave readings of their work during the "Evening of Words & Music" presentation at The Pearkes Centre. Donna Kane read a sample of her poems from her new book, "Somewhere, a Fire" and Vince Curley, Pat Markin and Jason Naisby provided musical interludes. Everybody had a very enjoyable and relaxing evening and we hope to have a similar event next year.
