

Art That Moves You is a visual arts initiative that will see locally painted artwork displayed on the exterior of City of Fort St. John Transit Buses for the summer months, starting on April 28, 2006 and running until September. The cards will measure 17" x 66" and will be painted by local artists. The artwork will be in the theme, Sunshine - Here Comes the Sun, and will provide a burst of colour to the exterior of the buses.

Art that Moves You is a joint initiative between the FSJ Community Arts Council, the City of Fort St. John and BC Transit. Each panel has also been sponsored by a local business.

This is a unique opportunity to support our local visual artists directly and we graciously thank our visual artists for the beauty that they bring to our city streets.
