

The Finch Water Tower Mural and Mentoring Project - Landmark Makeover

The Fort St. John Community Arts Council undertook a project to see the water reservoir in the Finch area of 106th Avenue and 106th Street painted with murals this summer. Shelley Mowat, Dawson Creek artist, worked with local youth on this project to train these young artists in the art of large mural painting. Christy Burres a college student from Dawson Creek along with Fort St. John artists, Clayton Backus, Joshua Kirschner, Gabrielle Odowichuk and Adam Kirschner worked with Shelley to create a beautiful mural on the water tower, in the concept of a 24-hour clock. The design includes a Spirit of the Olympics element with it's Ionic Columns and is very visual and flattering to the building. It highlights a large open



sky design taking the directional layout into consideration. The design features a dawn, morning, day, evening and night sky separated by the columns to give the wall depth. The project was both ambitious and exciting and adds great beauty to the highly visible building creating a lovely City Landmark.
