About Fort St. John

The City of Fort St. John has a lively history of development closely related to the natural resource industries and farming. Fort St. John, with a population of nearly 14,000, services an area population of 27,000. The city is located at Mile 49 on the famous Alaska Highway, making it a convenient stopping place for tourists. The Fort St. John airport provides direct connections by CP Air to Vancouver, Edmonton and Whitehorse. The long runways at the airport can accommodate a 747 aircraft.

The long daylight hours in the summer and the average snow fall in the winter provide ideal recreational conditions year round. The golf course, ball diamonds, parks and lakes provide summer recreation venues. The ski hill, ice-skating oval, cross country trails, arena and curling rink are available for winter sports. the Museum and Art Gallery are open all year for residents and visitors. Big game hunting and fishing attract international visitors.

The 13th Annual Western International Sled Dog Championships may draw mushers from as far away as Eastern United States and California, and Alaska. The sport of Sled Dog racing has been developed over the past 80 years to become a popular international event.

The Sled Dog Races were organized in Fort St. John by the Rotary Club in 1974 and originally started within the city limits. The rapidly expanding city made it difficult to prepare a suitable dog trail in the city. In 1977, the races were moved to Charlie Lake where a track is prepared by volunteers dragg-

ing a bed spring behind a snowmobile. The preparation takes about a week. An ideal track has fresh snow packed down rather than re-frozen snow or ice. The present location provides good viewing for spectators and unlimited space for the trails on the lake.

The 1986 Race will have 6 and 10 dog classes. The prizes will be \$5,000 and the Mukluk Rendezvous '86 Sled Dog Championships have been advertised in the Team and Trail Magazine for mushers.

Everyone is welcome to watch the races on Saturday February 1, and Sunday February 2 beginning at 10 a.m. each day. Between the races, various exciting activities will provide entertainment for the crowd.



The Dogs are Ready...

The fastest and most popular dog in Sled Dog racing is the Alaskan Husky which was bred for the two most important attributes of speed and stamina. Sled dogs tend to be small and lean, similar to well conditioned, human, long distance runners. Drivers, keep careful watch over the weight of each dog and feed measured portions of a mainly meat or chicken diet to keep each dog at ideal racing weight.

Most sled dogs are muscular with a slightly arched back, well angled shoulders and a deep chest for excellent lung capacity.

The dogs prefer to run in cold weather.

Spectators are requested to stay clear of the track and keep your pets at home. Injuries can happen when stray pets bolt onto the course. Visit the drivers between the races but allow them to work when they are trying to ready a team for a race.
