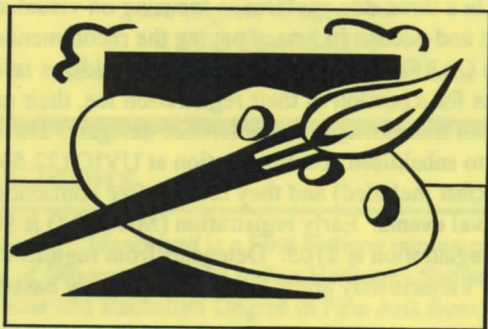

WHAT IS THIS ABOUT

Artists residing in the Peace-Liard (Northeast) region (the area bounded by Fort Nelson, Dawson Creek, Tumbler Ridge, Chetwynd and Fort St. John) are invited to enter the Peace-Liard Regional Juried Art Exhibition. This exhibition will be held April 20 - May 8th at the Dawson Creek Art Gallery and is hosted by the South Peace Arts Council and the Peace-Liard Regional Arts Council.

From the works submitted to the Peace-Liard Regional Juried Art Exhibition, jurors will select up to 10 pieces to represent the Peace-Liard Region at "artWORKS 99" a provincial wide exhibition of work selected from throughout B.C.. Artists may also enter slide submissions directly to the Festival (contact Yolanda Olivotto at 250-920-4118)

ArtWORKS is the visual arts component of the BC Festival of Arts, which will be held in Victoria, May 23-30, 1999.

Visual artists attending the Festival in Victoria will participate in a three-day conference focusing on visual artists concerns and needs. In lieu of paying the recommended minimum CARFAC fee, the BC Festival subsidizes selected artists for a portion of their registration fee, their meals, and in town transportation. Conference delegates also have access to subsidised accommodation at UVIC (22.50/night, breakfast included) and they receive free admission to most Festival events. Early registration (March 24) is \$80, and late registration is \$105. Delegates from regions distant from Victoria may apply for a travel subsidy based on need.

The BC Festival of the Arts is the only festival of its kind in Canada. At the regional level, 100,000 people will participate as artists (visual, performance, literary, theatre, speech, film & video), audience and volunteers. Through local and regional events, over 1000 delegates advance to the BC Festival of Arts. This includes approximately 150 visual artists, selected from throughout BC who will participate in artWork 99 this year at the Festival in Victoria.

For those not residing in the Peace-Liard Region, contact your local arts council for information.

Kinetic works must meet public safety standards

CRITERIA

There are no restrictions as to media or size of artworks.

Artworks, individually or collaboratively produced, including traditional, contemporary, and indigenous work are welcome (clay, computer generated images, drawing, fibre, film, glass, installation, metal, mixed media, multimedia, neon, organic materials, painting, performance art, photocopy art, photography, printmaking, sculpture, video, wood).

In the case of performance art, a 15 minute maximum segment of the work (either live or video) is acceptable for submission to the jury. For installations, submit video, slides, photographs, marquette and/or drawings, with written explanation and dimensions.

- 1 Entry is open to artists of all ages, and all racial and cultural backgrounds.
- 2 Please include a statement with the work
- 3 Only ORIGINAL works are eligible. No copies, mechanical reproductions, kits or commercial moulds will be accepted (unless they are an integral part of the work itself). Work produced as a class assignment or in a workshop is not eligible.
- 4 Any work previously submitted in a regional juried exhibition for artWorks may not be resubmitted.
- 5 Works must have been completed after January, 1997 (within the last two years).
- 6 Work may be submitted in only one region, the region in which you reside.

EXHIBITION & TOURING NOTE

For works which require specific installation, instructions must be attached. If special equipment is required to view a work, as in the case of film or video, the artist may be required to supply it.

All media, sizes and types of work are eligible for selection. However the host arts council, the artist and the host gallery, working co-operatively, may limit the exhibition and touring of certain works, if such exhibition and touring could be detrimental to the works themselves, or would impose inordinate handling or display problems on the host gallery.

EXHIBITION INFORMATION

PRESENTATION

Work must be suitably prepared for exhibition, ready for presentation. Wall mounted work must be appropriately framed or stretched with hanging eyelets affixed on both sides near top, wired ready for hanging. To ensure display as artist intends, instructions may be included. Work not properly prepared for exhibition may not be exhibited. The Dawson Creek Art Gallery reserves the right to make the final decision on the display of the works.

AVAILABILITY

All works must be available from April 19 -May 9. artWORKS selected works must be available for extended exhibition at Dawson Creek Art Gallery (April 20-May8th), the Peace-Liard Regional Art Tour (dates to be announced), and the provincial exhibition, artWORKS May 22-26, 1999. Works will be returned in June.

SALES

The South Peace Community Arts Council will retain a 35% commission for all works (or orders) sold. Works chosen for Images & Objects will be sold on the condition that the buyer shall not take possession until after the work has been exhibited at ArtWORKS. Buyer may not claim works until after all exhibition requirements have been fulfilled. Works not for sale (NFS) should be labelled as such and should include a value for insurance purposes. The insured value of each work will be at least 35% less than the sale price, meaning it will not include commission.

INSURANCE

While every precaution will be taken to ensure the care and safety of the entries, the Dawson Creek Art Gallery, Peace Gallery North, Phoenix Theatre (Fort Nelson), Tumbler Ridge Public Library, Chetwynd collection site, or any of their members, staff or volunteer workers cannot assume responsibility for loss due to accident, damage, theft, fire or other causes for works submitted to the jury. Insurance is the responsibility of the artist.

AGREEMENT

Artists must sign the waiver on the enclosed registration form.

LABELS

All works must be securely labelled on the BACK with the information requested on the enclosed registration form.

ARTIST'S STATEMENT

Artists statement form must accompany each work: tape lightly to the back of the work.

Shipping & Collection

All works must be protected in an individual container, labelled with name, address, phone# and title of work to ensure safe return. Shipping costs will be the responsibility of the artist: works not picked up will be returned COD. Fragile works should be extra protected.

The Jurors

Barbara P. Marchand is a First Nations contemporary artist of Okanagan Native Indian Heritage. She has a Diploma and Bachelors Degree in Fine Arts from Okanagan University College. She is currently a Visual Arts Instructor for the Certificate Programs in Indigenous Fine Arts, University of Victoria, at the En'owkin Centre in Penticton B.C.. Barbara has received a number of awards and has had numerous art works and personal interviews published and televised, as well as given lectures and presentations on her Multi Media Interdisciplinary art works. Since 1977, she has explored two and three dimensional form, illustrating, installations works, theatre, photography, video, computer graphics and animation. She has had a number of Regional Solo and Two Artist Exhibitions, and participated in a variety of Provincial Art Exhibitions.

A regional juror will be chosen to represent a northern perspective. Name and bio to be announced.
