Criteria

- All media, sizes, and types of work will be accepted.
- Open to artists of all ages from all cultures.
- Only original art work is eligible. No copies from magazines, mechanical reproductions, kits or commercial molds.
- Works previously displayed in the Peace Liard Regional Art Exhibit are ineligible.
- Work must have been completed after January 2003.
- Limit of **three** entries per artist.
- Entry fees are \$10.00 per entry.
- Works difficult to move due to size, weight or fragility should not be entered.

Categories

A. OPEN

Artists may submit **original** work to the open category that is representative of their own creativity and expression.

B. STUDENT

This category is specifically for artists attending Middle or Senior Secondary Schools within the Peace Liard Region (home-school students can also apply in this category).

C. CLASS PROJECT

Work submitted to this category is created in a class environment under the direction of an instructor. The work can be by an individual artist or a collaboration.

Exhibition Requirements

PRESENTATION

All work must be ready for hanging and/or suitably prepared for exhibition. All specific exhibit instructions should be included with the work. The hosting organizations have the right to the final decision on the exhibition of the works.

2. **Complete Form B** and attach it to the back of your work. All work must be properly labeled on the back with the Title, Artist Name, Address, Phone, Selling Price and/or Value (for Insurance purposes) and Category.
3. **Complete Artist Statement Form C** and send it with the work (Optional)
4. Send work with **Form B** on back and **Artist Statement Form C** to the Dawson Creek Art Gallery at the above address.

Feature Speaker Tina Martel

As an emerging artist in today's art world, it is important to have the skills and knowledge to document and promote your work. Guest speaker, Tina Martel, will explain the process needed to access galleries and other exhibition opportunities as well as how to record your work for posterity. Tina will also present examples of her recent work.

Tina earned a BFA (with honors) in the painting department of the Alberta College of Art and Design in Calgary and a MFA, also in painting, at the University of Calgary. She is currently a full time instructor at Grande Prairie Regional College. Although Martel admits to being a painter, she more commonly refers to herself as a "maker of objects". Her current mixed media work combines acrylic paint, hand made paper, silver and copper leaf, printed papers, and medium on 3-dimensional structures. Martel creates images whose content embraces a combination of spirituality, personal and art history. She has exhibited across Canada and internationally in Germany, New York, Omaha and Tel Aviv.

Doug Wills received a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from The University of Calgary in 1981 and has been a practicing artist since that time. Majoring in Ceramics and Sculpture, his recent interests have been in the areas of Graphic Design and mixed media paper work. He worked for 16 years at a gallery and framing shop in Calgary, he was also Ceramic technician at the Alberta College of Art & Design for 13 years.
