

Chairman's Report; to the Thursday, January 8th meeting of the North Peace Legacy Committee.

It may appear that the NPELPC is waiting on, a) closing a deal with the Bay people; and, b) receiving word from the Federal government regarding a grant. Although the actualization of these things would provide the most dramatic change, in a positive direction, many other areas of the Legacy Committee activities are worthy of attention.

The ongoing function of the Fundraising Committee can now concentrate effort on corporate and local entities. Endowment funding can commence with possession of the building.

Completely revised floor plans have been presented to the various tenant groups for final approval. These plans should assist in engaging an architect at the best possible price and ensure that ample time has been lent to arriving at a functional final stage of design.

Work can now begin in consideration of the establishment of a Building Committee.

In March, we will enjoy an all-day workshop with an expert consultant who has been involved with projects similar to the Expo Legacy Project, throughout Canada. With this workshop we should be able to glean invaluable information with regards design, promotional, fundraising and administration.

Exceedingly good coverage through the Promotional Committee has enabled us to keep the public well informed. Great cooperation from AHN, and CKNL have facilitated this. Thanks goes to them. The thermometer sign on the building has been changed and is more comprehensive now.

The public has also begun to use the paper to voice concerns and support for our efforts. These are encouraged since it is difficult to describe a project of this magnitude in twenty-five words or less.

More volunteer work is progressing on a scale model of the New Building, which, on completion, we will be able to display publically.

We are now engaged with discussion and consideration regarding incorporation as a non-profit Society. Presently the NPELPC is an ad hoc committee with both power and responsibility ultimately resting with the Regional Boards. To join together as a Society seems necessary to best serve the public at large. Responsibilities will be defined and distributed among the many volunteers now involved. To accomplish this step prudently and effectively, much discussion is, and will be necessary.

In short, the NPELPC continues to be active in pursuing the goal of establishing a much needed New Library and Arts Complex to benefit the entire community. Again we encourage people to voice their interest and their concern regarding this project which will positively affect their future.

It has been 18 months since the inception of this committee. Receipt of the 1,000,000 dollars from the Provincial Lottery Fund is an indication of how effectively past volunteers have worked. It is a tough act to follow! But we are intent on doing just that, to follow through to completion this laudable endeavour that concerned, visionary, individuals began.

If the North Peace Expo Legacy Committee is sometimes seen as a "high pressure group" could this not be simply because of a misunderstanding of the effective and thorough job that it is doing to improve our Northern Community?

PURPOSE OF EXTRAORDINARY MEETING

Pat Walsh read a letter from the Bay (see attached) which offers a selling price for the Bay of \$405,000.00. He stated that the dilemma is: a very attractive purchase price vs. desirability of Bay building, pending a decision from the architect. Does the committee want to make a decision now?

John Herron stated that offer should be subject to clauses and concerns of the architects, but it will be a month before figures are ready. He feels that we should stall the Bay Co. Pat Walsh feels that this would be 'less than polite'. Discussion followed about pros and cons of purchasing now, adding 'subject to' clauses, and meetings with the architects.

Willa suggested simply suggesting to the Bay that they wait until the end of the summer to decide on their offer, thereby allowing full committee to be present and to allow time to hear from the architect. Suggested that deciding previous to architects' report is defeating purpose for hiring architects.

Mike suggested not replying at all until after August 21st meeting with architects. Pat Walsh has already sent a letter of acknowledgement to Bay Co of the offer.

Carolyn Krauss moved

"That we don't make any decisions until after the architects have finished compiling their reports and until the committee has met with them."

John Herron on behalf of the Building Committee, asks that the Society get together soon to help out with future plans. The architects are urging this step. The Society is urged to meet within the next month. The operations committee must look at the decision making role of the building committee vs the Society.
