



The future of our community is in your hands. Let's see what you are going to do with it!!





RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Arts Fair is open to all students residing in School District #60.
2. All entry forms to be submitted by 5 pm Tuesday, April 5th, 1988.
3. Entries are to be delivered to the Artspace, 10003 - 100th Street, office hours are: Mon - Fri 9 am - 5:30 pm, Phone 785-1988
4. All entries become the property of the Arts Fair for the duration of the Fair.
5. Upon completion of the Fair, each entrant is responsible for pick up of individual entries.
6. Students may enter only once in each category. Each entry must be made on an official entry form.
7. Each entry must clearly show student name, age, school & category.
Title of entry must appear where applicable.
8. A program of competition and show times will be available by April 8th.
9. The Arts Fair Committee reserves the right to determine eligibility of entry.
10. First and Second Place will be awarded in each category. All entries will receive participation awards.
11. **VISUAL ARTS:** entries must be of original design, unconventional method or materials and be developed from the entrant's imagination. Originality and imagination will be major areas of judging.
12. **PERFORMING ARTS:** entries must be of original composition or choreography unless otherwise specified in category description. Entries must be no less than 2 minutes and no more than 4 minutes in length (except Drama). Music Compositions are to be written out and a copy submitted on the day of competition. Students in the 9 years & under may have assistance in writing out their compositions. Older students must write their own. Dance entries may be in any style. Entrants must supply their own accompaniment. Taped music must be cued and labelled.



The fair went well and by the look of the figures at present it at least broke even if not a little better.


As with the first year for most projects the fair was not as large as I had hoped but all who participated seemd to enjoy themselves. The entries were all very well done and proved to be interesting on the whole. The unconventional and unusual concept that we had stressed surfaced in only some of the works. We have a great number of very talented artists in our student population and I hope that the system and society continue to support and encourage these young people.

There were far fewer entries than we had anticipated and that was somewhat disappointing. If the students had more support and encouragement from the teachers and their parents the numbers would be far greater. I feel that we need to make clear to these people the important roll that the arts play in the lives and total development of our children.

In the future if an Arts Fair is to be put on it would be my suggestion that it be in June and that the information be put out to the schools before Christmas. Another option would be to combine with the Festival and cover the areas that it does not.

I will submit to you a financial statement as soon as it is complete.
