Banner Camp - Art Competition

A juried art competition in which successful candidates, receive the opportunity to create a banner to hang in our Municipality, throughout the summer and into the Christmas season.

Banner Camp submissions must be received by March 25, 1994.

Theme

In celebration of an exciting and full year, planned to develop our community pride; we ask *you* the students to decorate our city through the painting of banners, based on these themes:

Bicentennial - The 200th Anniversary of our area. When designing your entry keep in mind...History, livelihoods, the people, etc..

Airshow - Our second Biannual event! Design this banner to suit your perception of an airshow, airplane, events...

Commonwealth Games - The Passing of the Queen's Baton. What is the Commonwealth Games to you? Sports, Community, Culture...

The banners will hang throughout our Community; starting the official opening day June 3rd through to the Christmas Season.

USE YOUR IMAGINATION...*But remember, designs must stay simplistic due to restrictions involved in painting, and viewing. All selected entrants will be contacted, and asked to participate in the painting of their design on to the formatted canvas banner.*

Entry Rules and Procedures

1. This competition is open to all students registered within School District #60 Schools, during the 1993/94 school year.
2. Your submission, if accepted by the jury, is a commitment of your participation in painting your design on the banner.

entry rules cont.

7. Include the completed entry form, with your design submission.
8. All entries and banners become the property of Peace Gallery North, and the City of Fort St. John.
9. There is no limit to the entries allowed by one person.
10. Peace Gallery North reserves the right to refuse using any completed banner.

Criteria For Design Selections

Relation to theme
Originality of Design
Success of Composition
Design transition to banner
Overall appearance from a distance
Integrity of work (time & care)

The Selection Committee will choose between 150 to 260 designs. Their decisions, and any further information will be presented to the Student's School.

Banner Workshop

Professional artists will conduct painting workshops for all students whose design has been accepted. The workshop will help you translate your designs in to the finished work of art (Banner). The workshop dates and times will be announced at a later date. Accepted participants will be notified as soon as the times are confirmed.

3. Keep a copy of your design and all submitted information for your records.

4. The actual banner area in which you will be painting is 20 x 36". Banner will be juried on the basis of a template size of 6.67 x 12", show colour as accurately as possible (please note not all colours will be available for painting.) Your template should be carefully finished and presented to give the feeling of the finished banner. We suggest you use opaque tempera, ink, felt tip pens, or acrylic paint. Do not use crayons or chalk.

5. Students under 15 are welcomed, and encouraged to find a sponsor adult, who will assist in the painting on the banner.

6. Your entry need not be on the template provided. Please mark the following information on the back of your entry.

- *Your name (Jurors will not see names);
- *Your School; and
- *title of the banner
