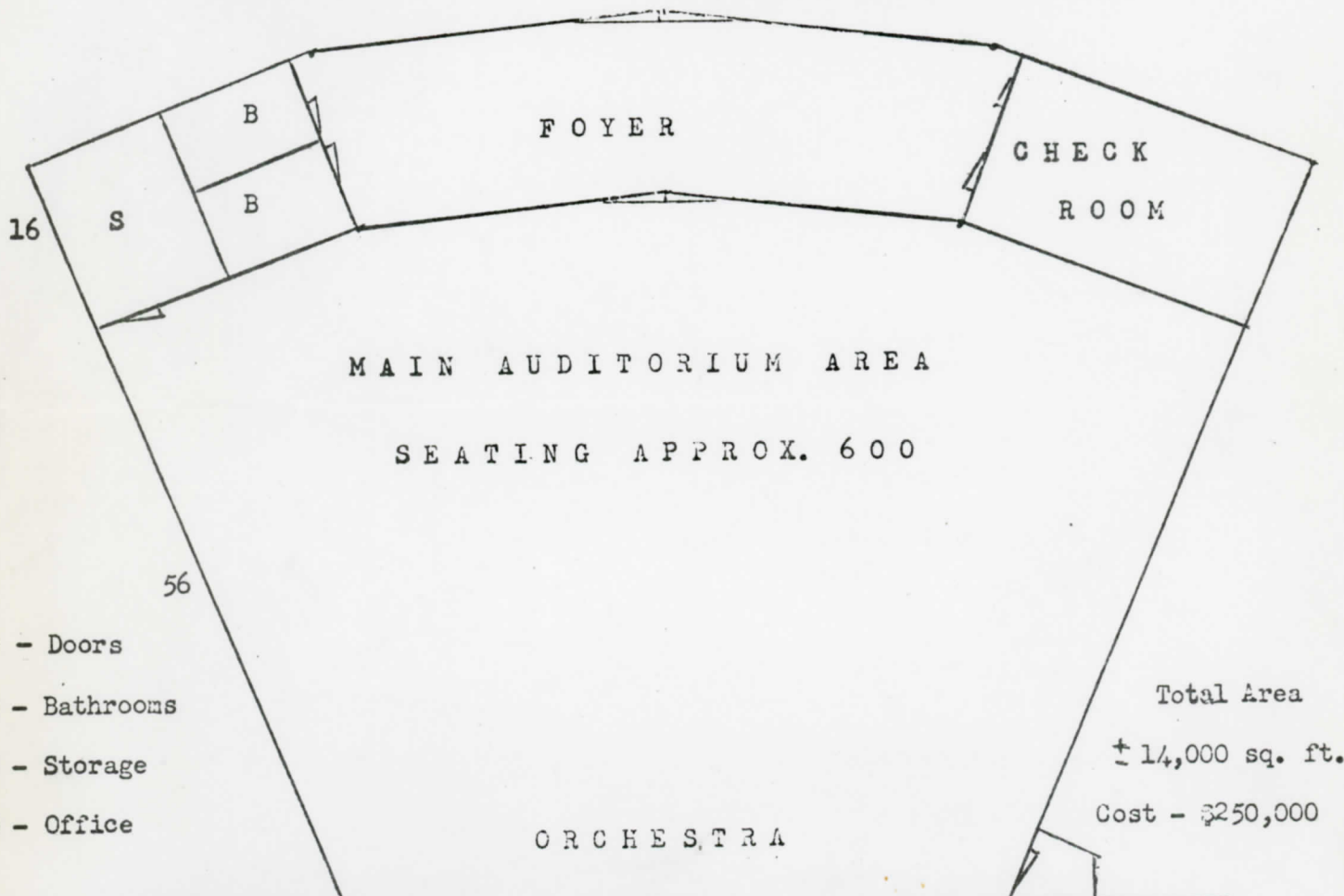
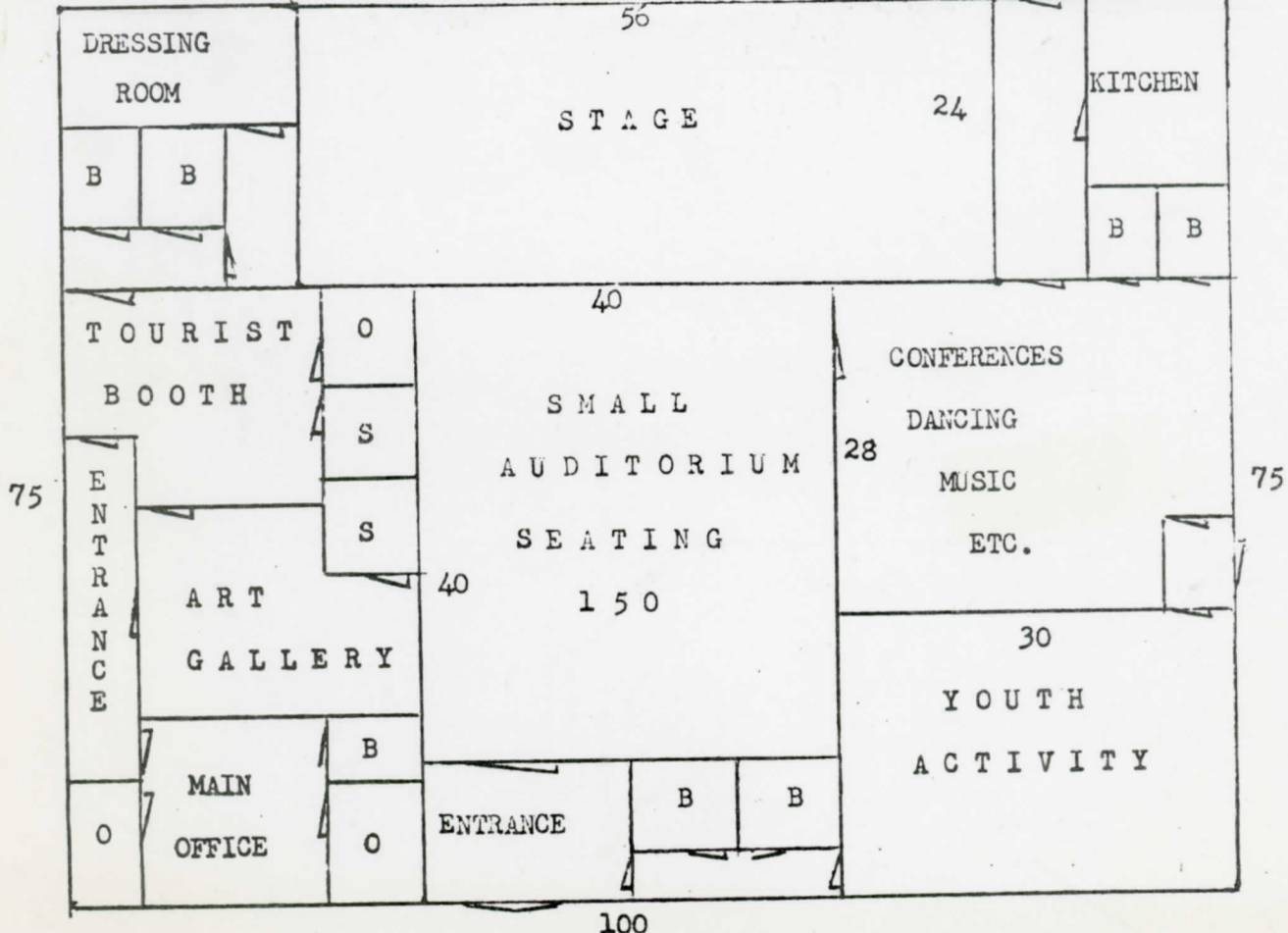

IT'S THE COMMUNITY CENTRE PROPOSED AS A COMMEMORATIVE PROJECT BY YOUR FORT ST. JOHN CENTENNIAL COMMITTEE.

Way back, when the centennial committee was young (about six months ago) the public was asked for suggestions for a 1971 commemorative project. A community centre was the most popular choice, so we have come up with a plan.

IF WE BUILD THIS:

WHICH BRINGS US TO ANOTHER POINT:

How will it be run? It will have to have a manager and a board of directors. It should be self-supporting. Revenue will come from office rentals, auditorium rentals, concessions, and basement display area.
