

ormer resident Ken Jeannotte will be returning to Fort St. John, bringing with him samples of his work. 'A Pale Caress' - which opens Apr. 10 at Peace Gallery North - is an exhibition of landscape-based photographic images. The exhibition is the result of a project that began with images gathered on and around the Chilcotin plateau and expanded to include work shot in the North Peace and the North Okanagan. Three years of shooting, printing, historical research and writing resulted in this body of works.

'sense of place', land use and ownership and environmental Mr. Jeannotte grew up on a farm near Fort St. John and graduated from NPSS in 1966. He studied at the Kootenay School of Art in Nelson where he graduated in painting and print making in 1969. He returned to Fort St. John in 1972 and was one of several local artists, volunteers and support staff to create the Peace Arts Centre. The store-front art school offered classes in drawing, painting, ceramics, sculpture and batik and was attended by more than 100 students for each of the three, four-month terms that it operated.


Tom Sawyer
