Originator of the program Mike Waberski emphasizes that the program will be handled in a business-like fashion and that "this is not a work bee."

"Some contractors in this town have more time than cash and they have very valuable talents," he said.

The mini-contractors would be able to draw on the general labor pool for additional labor, which will kept on a computer system by Arche Computere Systems for easier access to the total picture. Journeymen as well as home handymen or novices can pledge a week of work.

"Labor pool participants would, in effoect be working for the contractor who has the responsibility of the mini-contract," explained Waberski.

Pledge forms for labor and supplies are available at Irly Bird, Buffalo

Bob's, Waberski Surveys and Arche Computer Systems. The seven businesses that have led the way in the Give-a-Week program are: Waberski Surveys, Colteran Developments, WL Construction, Associated Glass, Derrick Plumbing and Heating, Warner Construction and Rosebrook Flooring and Paints.

This program was designed for those businesses that cannot afford to give cash donations but have the spirit and expertise to contribute to the community. But the committee says in a news release that the give-a-week Program can not replace cash donations and businesses are urged to donate cash whenever possible.

However, Waberski says the Give-a-Week program "gives everyone the opportunity to be part of the city's pride and spirit in 'Doing -for-ourselves'."
