We have started our Art Card fundraiser. Mme Suzon will be completing the cards with most of our students. We will be selecting some cards to print and sell to the general public as sets.

**Stage North Theatre Society:** Director Ted Sloan is rehearsing the cast for the opening of 12 Angry Jurors Mar 4 which will continue Mar 5, 10, 11, 12 at the NPCC. Get your tickets now. Stage North plans to do *Unnecessary Farce* in the Spring and take part in the Peace River Zone Theatre Festival.

**Peace River Zone Theatre BC:** Karla Pratt is the Zone Chairperson and the representative to Theatre BC from our region. The Peace River Zone Theatre Festival is scheduled for May 24-29, 2016 at NPCC. Community theatre groups from NE BC will compete for the opportunity to go to Mainstage, the provincial theatre competition in July. Ted Sloan is the Festival Chair for the Peace River Zone.

Fort St John Community Arts Council 2016/17 – Grant Adjudication Meeting March 9, 2016

Call to Order: 7:10 PM, by Rosemary Landry

Treasurer's Report – Discussed copy of grant distribution. FSJCAC received \$15,000.00 from the City of FSJ. There was no increase, again. Twenty member groups applied. The maximum a member group can request is 35% of their budget, Connie had to adjust each of the groups request by 35% so that it came under the \$15,000.00. Also adjusted based on info received, if financial statements and budgets were properly presented. The highest award is \$975. There is \$374 remaining that needs to be allocated. The member groups need to decide what to do with this amount. Discussion took place. Funds from the 2015 Grant awards still remaining to be distributed \$5,427.15. These funds need to be used by June 30, 2015.

Motion made by Rosemary give the extra money to PR North Festival, seconded by Sabrina. Carried.

Motion to accept the adjudication allocation as presented. Barb moved, Sabrina seconded. Carried.

Those groups with a Charitable Tax Number can just request their funds once they send their Charitable Tax Number to the Arts Council.

Any publications such as posters, brochures, etc must acknowledge the City of Fort St John's support. Please send the FSJCAC pictures and posters, etc and this information is used in the FSJCAC presentation to the City of Fort St John for next year's grant.

Connie pointed out the total budgets for all the member groups is \$580,000 and factoring a 2.5 CPI, over \$1.5 Million circulates in the community because of the member art groups and this doesn't take into account the NPCC and FSJCAC budgets. Neither the FSJCAC nor NPCC can apply for a grant. The NPCC receives funding directly from the City and the City has mandated the FSJCAC receive no funds, despite the fact they organize and administer the grant and grant allocation.

North Peace Spinners & Weavers Guild – Karla King - In February, we held an intown retreat, mostly at the Arts Post. We had about 10 people turn out for a tour of the museum, saw the exhibits and got to go in the back room and see some of the handmade articles that Marjo Wheat is researching. We had some people weaving

on the studio looms, a few were working on inkle looms, some spinning. We are in the early planning stages of a workshop for 2017, trying to get Caroline Sommerfield to come and do an art yarn workshop with us.

One of our members has been working with some local homeschooling families learning about fibre processing and knitting. There's been lots of interest in this and it's great to see. We even have interest from the Wonowon 4H.

Last year's Christmas Sale at the beginning of December was a great success and we're already talking about next year's sale and gearing up to create items for it.

Some of our members also volunteered at the Museum's Hands-On Day on March 5<sup>th</sup>.

**FSJ Dance Society** – Jennifer Decker – The dancers competed at a festival in Quesnel in February. There are upcoming competitions in Fort St John in April and in Edmonton in May. For fundraising, Valentine's Day was well received and currently doing a Purdy's Chocolate Easter fundraiser and scorekeeping at the Oilmen's Hockey Tournament.

**Northern Dance Theatre Society** – Christine Todd – At the end of February, dancers went to the Quesnel Dance Festival and did very well representing Fort St John. Currently dancers are in Prince George at the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Dance Festival of the Arts. This dance festival is one week long. Dancers have been doing a wonderful job representing Fort St John. There has been media coverage. On Friday there will be a gala performance and various dancers/groups will be chosen to perform.

In May we will be holding a Gala at the Cultural Centre showcasing our graduating students and Festival performances. This will be a wonderful entertaining show. Please come out to watch and support NDTS.

Dancers have been participating in the local Tapping into Talent Shows. Ballet exams will be coming up after competitions.

**Performing Arts Festival Assoc** – Margaret May - Hard at work with both Festivals. The regional festival Apr 10-17 is the qualifier for Provincials May31- June 4<sup>th</sup>, also taking place in Fort St John this year. **FSJ Film Society** – Megan Singh – The last film shown *Trumbo* on March 14th was well received as opposed to the previous 2 films, they were a bit more dark in nature. Still 3-4 more films on the schedule, 2 in April and one in May, trying to get a second film for May.

**Federation of Canadian Artists/Flying Colours** – Rosemary Landry - workshop with David Langevin on acrylics, took a different approach to the use of acrylics. Workshop on printmaking and bookmaking coming up.

**North Peace Potters Guild** – Rosemary Landry – The group is busy trying to get Chili bowls made well before the sale, Chili Bowl Bash in June.

**North Peace Cultural Centre** – Connie Surerus – The dimmer rack that controls the lighting in the theatre finally "died" and we have had to order a new one. The cost is \$50,000 so we are applying for grants and approaching businesses for donations. We will be making a special request to Taylor and PRRD as well and we are asking for support from the community and the user groups as well.
