## Spinners, weavers to hold conference

The Peace Country Spinners and Weavers regional organization and Alberta culture are presenting a two-day conference of workshops at Falher College in Fahler, Alta. on March 15 and 16.

The keynote speaker, Edmontonian Cr. Peter Poohkay, a noted authority and tacher of Ukrainian weaving, will give two one-day workshops on Poyas (sash) weaving. He will also have a lecture and slides of his research trip to the Ukraine. Dr. Poohkay, a semiretired dentist, has taught at the Banff School of Fine Arts and has given workshops throughout Canada. He is a proficient weaver not only of traditional Ukrainian patterns, but also fine fabrics which he has tailored for his own suits and jackets.
