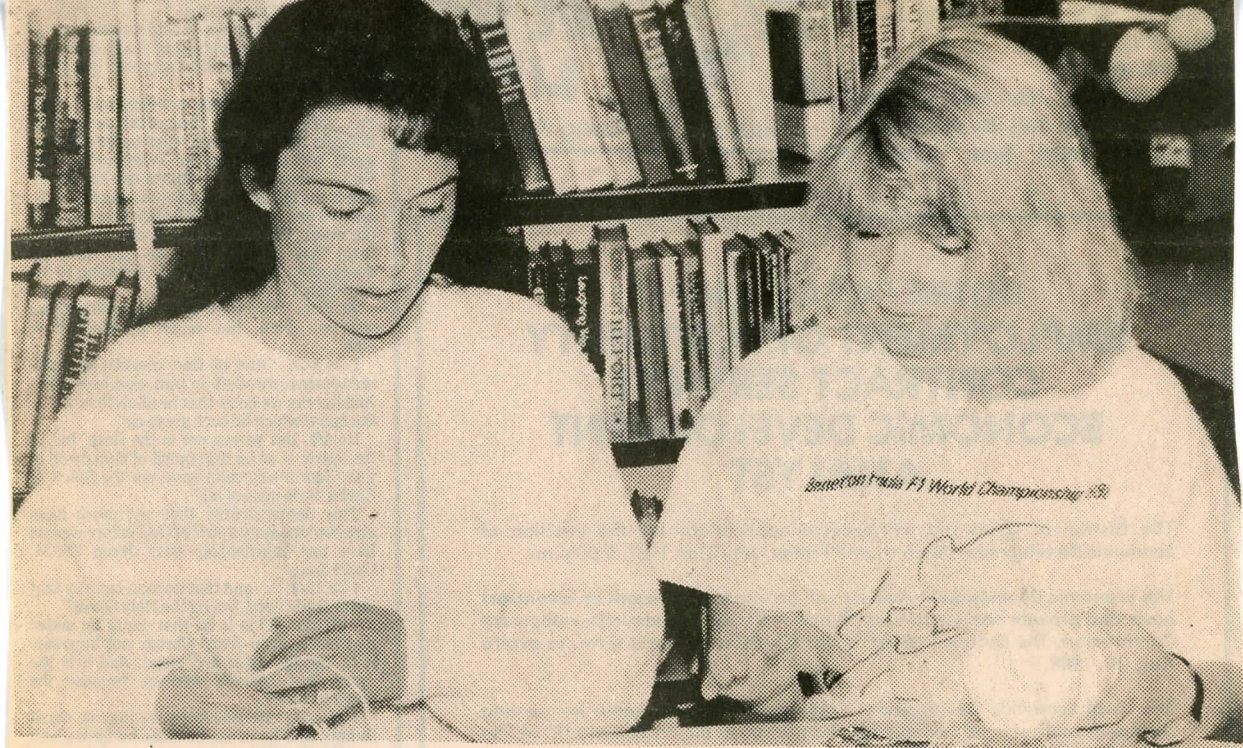

Two summer students have added to the staff at the Fort St. John public library through the Challenge 87 program.

Though Juanita Cusack and Teri Froese will be spending a good part of their time taking inventory, they will also be responsible the organization and implementation of a children's program every Tuesday and Thursday morning.

"We'll read stories, play games, sing songs and do crafts," Cusack said.

The first day is for children ranging from three to six years of age while Thursday's session involves children aging from seven to 10.

"We'll do more of the same things with them but on a different level," she said.

Teaching music for a number of years and working part time as a

teacher's aide, Cusack said the work she's doing now will help prepare her in her desire to become an elementary teacher.

"It'll be a good experience for me," the 17 year-old said. Cusack will be taking an Education program at Grande Prairie College this fall while Froese will remain in the city to start her 11th year at North Peace Senior Secondary High School.
