Torches draws from its influence from Galatian Christian times. Its power suggests the strength of prehistoric Celts who by the time of Christ's birth had become the province of Galatia, known in modern times as Ankara, Turkey.

A new and locally connected piece is Irving Berlin's White Christmas, arranged for the Jazz Choir by Vancouver jazz musician Brian Day, originally of Dawson Creek.
