FORT ST. JOHN — Cinderella, Jack and the Beanstalk, witches, wolves and mysterious potions are taking the stage tomorrow night in Dr. Kearney Middle School's production of Into the Woods Jr.

The story wraps all the fairy tales that you know and love together to tell the tale of a baker and his wife who desperately want a child, but can't have one.

"Right now we can't, because a curse was laid on the baker," explained Grade 9 student Lacey Keough, who plays the baker's wife.

The couple enters into a deal with a witch in order to get what they want.

"We have to do this little mission in the forest, and he's starting to push me away because he's like, 'I'm a man, I can do this.' So I'm trying to help him fulfill the mis-



Keough feels mostly ready for opening night, but has a few of those nervous stage fright jitters. Getting into character sometimes feels silly, she says, but the end result is worth it.

"It's almost a little bit embarrassing when you get full in character, it's almost a social thing you've got to get over, because you're like, 'Oh what if they're looking at me right now, because I'm actually in character? What if they're making fun of me?'

"But if everyone's in character, it turns out really good, because you can't just kind of half do your job, you've got to make it look realistic." she said.

The middle school students, in Grade 8 and 9, have been working hard on the play for four months, putting in approximately 250 hours a piece of extracurricular time, according to Katie Matthews,

director and drama teacher at the school.

"Everyone in the class gets a part, and then from there we do after school rehearsals... so I do that voluntarily and the kids do that voluntarily as well," she said.

Band students, under the direction of teacher Sandra Gunn, perform the music.

"Our band actually plays all of our music, we don't use a CD," Matthews said.

"We work as a team, Sandra and I, to make sure that as many kids are involved as possible, because of course we both believe that the arts are super important in schools, and we want to foster a lifelong love of music and theatre."

After all those rehearsal hours, the students are ready.

"They've been ready for a while now," Matthews said.

"They're excited, they're amped up to go, they know what they're doing... I'm pretty proud of them."

Into the Woods Jr. will take the stage at the North Peace Cultural Centre on Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Tickets, available at the cultural centre box office, are \$15 for adults, \$13 for seniors and students, and \$11 for children.

All money raised goes towards putting on next year's musical.





FORT ST. JOHN — Bert Bowes Middle School students are gearing up for their public performance of *The Phantom Tollbooth Jr.* on Friday night at the North Peace Cultural Centre.

The 1961 adventure novel by Norton Juster is a "super fun" story about a boy who is bored of everything in his life, and something magical happens to give him a fresh perspective on life, according to Irene Hayward, the play's director.

"His room is transformed, he gets a car, and tollbooth that take him through some

magical lands," she explained.

"He goes to a land of numbers, and a land of letters. He goes on all sorts of different adventures. He has to save princesses and fight off demons, and he learns a very important lesson: that 'what you can do is often simply a matter of what you will do,' so if you're willing try, you can do amazing things, is the moral of our story."

The Grade 7, 8, 9 and 10 students – there are a few high school kids helping out – overcame their nerves and jitters by performing for students from across the region on Thursday.

"That moment of going on stage for the first time and having about 200 people from their own school watching them is probably the hardest thing they go through," Hayward said.

Grade 9 student Jordan Bourgeois plays the lead character Milo.

"I'm 10, pretty much nothing is exciting, nothing interests me until this phantom toll-booth takes me on an adventure to teach me that everything has meaning," she said in in-

"Then I learn that everything is cool."

It's her first lead role, and so far she's loved the experience of practicing and rehearsing with her peers.

"It's been so much fun, after a while we all become like a little family," she said.

Grade 7 student Morgan Wigglesworth, who plays a handful of roles, including a vendor, and an advisor to the king, has also enjoyed every aspect of practicing for their big show.

"You do get pretty nervous before a show ... but it is really fun to be in musical theatre," he said. "I just love the whole thing."

North Peace Secondary School brings Guys and Dolls to the stage

All the glitz, glamour and gambling of 1940s New York City will be brought to life by local students this weekend.

The North Peace Secondary School production of *Guys and Dolls* features plenty of music, illegal gambling, and even a little romance.

Teacher Nadine Aulin chose Guys and Dolls as a way to change things up.

"I'm quite fond of the music itself, I think it was a fun segue away from some of the Disney stuff and I wanted to see what other kinds of audiences we could get in Fort St. John into the theatre. I'm hoping *Guys and Dolls* will bring in a wide range of people," she said.

Guys and Dolls tells the story of a group of gamblers looking to find a location for a high stakes craps game. A bet is made to land the money needed to secure a location for the game, and chaos ensues.

The mastermind behind the game is Nathan Detroit, played by Alexander Collins. Nathan has two very different sides, says Collins.

T "Nathan's kind of a funny cguy, he's a bit two-faced in that he has a business persona and a personal persona," said Collin. "So when he's with his men, Benny and Nicely, ethis hired guys, he's very stern und 'I only want things done then I want them done,' really

conservative, but at the same time he's also really tender and loving to his fiancée even though he's incredibly scared of committment."

Nathan's long-suffering fiancée Adelaide is played by Elan Miller-Jeannotte, who has to deal with Nathan's inability to commit, even though the pair have been together for 14 years.

"She knows that he's ready but he doesn't want to admit it, because he's so afraid of commitment because he's so into the craps game, she feels like she's coming second to his gambling," said Miller-Jeannotte.


In order to get the \$1,000 needed to hold the craps game, Nathan makes a bet with Sky Masterson, played by Brenden Wan, a gambler who cannot refuse any bet.

"He's a very, very confident high stakes gambler, he loves to make bets for lots of money over the craziest things. He's never found anyone he's really loved, maybe his parents, but he's not found that one girl because he's a player," said Wan.

That all changes when Sky meets Sarah, the woman Nathan bets him to take to Havana.


How does it all turn out? You'll have to check out the show to find out.


HICELY-HICELY JOHN?ON


