
Bill Haley and the Comets recorded Rock Around the Clock 50 years ago today, in 1954. It became the first rock 'n' roll hit to top the charts after its use in the film Blackboard Jungle. It's estimated that Rock Around the Clock has sold more than 23 million copies. Although he did not start rock 'n'

roll, Haley and his Comets put the music on the map. Their recordings caused mass hysteria and riots at concerts on both sides of the Atlantic.

### Today in History

May 12

Federal Industry Minister Sinclair Stevens resigned from cabinet 17 years ago today, in 1986, while a judicial inquiry examined a controversial \$2.6-million loan to a holding company he owned. Stevens denied he had broken conflict-of-interest guidelines and said he had no knowledge of the loan. But Justice William Parker of the Ontario Supreme Court ruled in 1987 that Stevens

violated the guidelines 14 times.

1870 — Royal assent was given to the Manitoba Act, allowing Manitoba to become Canada's fifth province.

1992 — Four suspects were arrested in the televised beating of trucker Reginald Denny, at the start of the explosive Los Angeles riots.
